Hello all,

Phew, what a relief that we are finally beginning to see the return of lighter mornings and evenings and I, for one, couldn't be happier! I love the different seasons, but by this time in the year I think we are all ready to see a bit of sun, feel a bit of warmth and have more opportunity to get out and about once the school day has ended.

This term continues to see lots of exciting opportunities for our children and it is great to see how these experiences help pupils to engage with their learning. These opportunities include: our Mini Police team meeting the police search dogs; Y1 visiting STEAM and learning about how the railways were built; Y2 making a bug house (we are all eagerly waiting to see the minibeasts it attracts!); and Y3 making some delicious bread to support their healthy eating topic.

The Masked Reader was a real highlight and very funny as the children tried to guess which teacher was 'behind the mask' as they read an extract of their favourite children's book. Aside from being a fun day, the important message behind World Book Day is the importance of reading and the pure joy that can be had from reading a good book – please do read with your child regularly: as a parent of a 22 and 27-year-old, the time when your child wants to snuggle up and read with you soon passes and the opportunity to do this with little ones is so precious.

As a headteacher, industrial action is always a tricky issue to navigate. I would again like to thank everybody for their understanding and the support that has been shown. As explained, I am extremely proud of my staff for giving notice of their intention to strike as I know this made it easier for our families to arrange childcare and allowed disruption to be made more manageable. There are two remaining strike days planned for 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> March. Information has already been shared via a separate letter.

Finally, and in keeping with tradition, I have saved the best until last...I am delighted to be able to tell you that our new website launched TODAY and I could not be more pleased with it – I really hope you like it too! 
If your child is not in school, they are missing out on learning and this is not fair on them.
