Wyvern Dance Festival



Here are some ideas of places to visit in and around Swindon which you might enjoy with your child(ren).



Town Gardens

This is a lovely park in Old Town where you can spend an hour or two. There is no entry charge and there is a wonderful child's play area with lots of play equipment for both older and younger children to enjoy. There is an aviary and a pond, a bandstand where bands often play on a Sunday, and some wonderful statues of Peter Pan and Richard Jefferies. There's also a lovely café with outdoor seating.



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Cotswold Wildlife Park and Gardens

Cotswold Wildlife Park is an excellent day out where you can spend time discovering lots of different animals. There is lots of space for children to run around and a playpark and a train ride to be enjoyed. The wildlife park is about a 45-minute drive from Swindon and is a whole day's entertainment.
