# Message from Mrs Dowdeswell



Welcome back! I hope you all had a wonderful summer and I offer a warm welcome to the new families and children who have joined us in Ash and Oak Classes. When I welcome the new children into Reception, I cannot help but think back to when my own two children started school: the butterflies in all of our tummies when they walked into their class on the very first day; the uniform that made them suddenly look so grown up; and the school bag that

looked so very big upon their backs. It is truly a special time for children and their families and I am so pleased that you chose our school family to support and nurture your son/daughter through the first part of their school journey.

Indeed, it has been wonderful to see all of the children settle so well across all year groups and it is always an exciting time as we embark on a new year of learning. The last academic year was an extremely successful one for our school and this was recognised by the many awards that the school received. These included:

- RHS School Gardening Award Level 1 and Level 2;
- Modeshift Stars Accreditation;
- Leader in Faith RE Award
- 360° Online Safety Mark Level 1, 2 and 3 (full accreditation)
- Swindon Mental Health and Emotional Wellbeing Award for Schools
- School Games Gold Award (awarded for second consecutive year!).
- Healthy Schools Mark bronze award.

We have also submitted work towards achieving the Primary Science Quality Mark, the Healthy Schools Mark Silver Award, and the Asthma Friendly School Award and are hopeful of receiving an update on these soon. I know you will join me in congratulating all of the staff and pupils in working so hard to achieve these awards.

In addition to this, we have set up our Evergreen Room to support children who need an additional level of support or individualised support; our netball court was built and a netball club will be running from this year; and our outdoor gym equipment has proved very popular with our children. We also introduced our careers curriculum whereby many visitors came to speak to our pupils about careers across many different professions and our forest school visits allowed all our pupils to engage with the outdoors to support their learning.

So, what an exciting time for our school as we move forward into a new school year and myself and the staff look forward to working with you during the coming school year to offer the very best education to the children of our school. Thank you as always for your ongoing support; we will always be stronger working together, and here's to a very successful school year for all of our pupils.

### Lateness



Sadly, we are already seeing some children regularly arriving late for school. This is extremely unsettling for the child as they often find it difficult to enter the class when all the other children are settled, and it is disrupting to the teacher and the rest of the children who have to pause the work they are doing for the late child to settle and catch up. It is really important your child is in school ready for the first lesson of the day to start at

**8:45am** so that they do not miss valuable learning and do not disadvantage their classmates. The most common reasons given for lateness is 'traffic' – if you drive your child to school, please ensure you leave in plenty of time to ensure your son/daughter is here on time or take advantage of the excellent breakfast club that runs at the school from 7:30am. Your support in this is greatly appreciated.

### **Harvest**

Our Harvest Mass will be led by the children in Year 5 at Holy Rood Church on Sunday 12th October at 5:30pm (children to arrive by 5:15pm). This is an important celebration for the whole school that

supports our learning in RE and British Values and all children are expected to attend. We have chosen the Swindon Food Collective as our Harvest charity again as they work tirelessly to help the families of Swindon. 
## Swimming - Y4

Swimming is such a valuable life skill and can bring so much fun and enjoyment; therefore, we are delighted to be able to offer swimming lessons for children in Y4 and Y5 this year. Swimming starts for children in Y4 from Tuesday 30<sup>th</sup> September and children will need to

bring:

- a one-piece swimming costume or trunks;
- a towel;
- a swimming hat if your child has long hair.
