Throughout the year in foundation stage we will be looking at the 7 different areas of learning. This topic web explains some of the things we will be looking at during this term.

Communication and Language.

- Can sit quietly during an activity.
- o Can listen and then complete an activity.
- o Understands some humour.
- Asking questions.
- Uses different tenses.
- Extends vocabulary and uses new vocabulary in role play.

Physical Development.

- Can stand on one foot and maintain balance for a short amount of time.
- o Can catch a ball using both hands.
- Can write some letters and copy their name.
- Experiment moving in a variety of different ways on and around equipment and can practise jumping and landing safely.
- Manages own risk assessment.
- Helps to put away equipment correctly.
- Continuing to use tools effectively while showing a dominant hand.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development.
